(Arrangements are made through the school counselor for information on how to attain these credits.)

InformNet

InformNet is an online learning experience. In most ways students are evaluated using the same procedures as the regular program. This includes traditional methods such as tests and projects. Evaluation is also based on formal learning demonstrations. Tests and projects are sent via the Brightspace or through email. Provincial testing and standards exams are written as per the regulations of Manitoba Education and Training and are written at the student's home-school with the other students.

Private Music Option

Students can earn up to 4 optional credits if they meet the requirements of the Conservatory Canada or the Royal Conservatory programs. "The Private Music Option is recognized only as additional credits beyond the minimum 30 credits required for high school graduation. Beginning September 2017 the Private Music Option will no longer be recognized to fulfill graduation requirements. Community Service Credit

Students can earn a ½ credit (55 hours) or 1 full credit (110 hours) for volunteer service within the community. The volunteer hours need to be pre-approved and also verified by an adult supervisor.

Credit for Employment (CFE) - more information can be obtained from the school career counsellor

Internship Program Credit

(CDI) allows students to earn high school **credit** for an unpaid internship, to encourage and recognize the skills development and experience gained through **ethe internship program**. Students may earn a maximum of 2 CDI credits towards graduation in Grade 11 and Grade 12

Special language credits

Students who can demonstrate their proficiency in a language other than English or French may earn up to 4 credits.

High School Apprenticeship Option (HSAP)

Students can earn credit towards an apprenticeship through HSAP which allows you to start your apprenticeship training while you are still in high school. It combines regular high school instruction with paid, part-time, on-the-job training.
